Dark and earthy up front, the 2019 Amarone della Valpolicella Classico Ravazzol mixes notes of tobacco and cedary spice with balsamic-laced cherries and clove. It is soothing and round, with silken waves of ripe red berry fruit elevated by juicy acidity, as a bitter tinge of cocoa settles in under an air of rosy inner florals. The 2019 is exceptionally long and lightly tannic, revealing a strong mineral component offset by a twang of sour citrus. Ravazzol is a tremendously complex and savory Amarone sure to enjoy a very long life.

Alessandro Castellani is one of the most progressive winemakers in Valpolicella today. His pursuit of savory, complex, long-lived Valpolicella began decades ago, placing Ca' La Bionda way ahead of the game when the rest of the region began to embrace this style. The Amarones are structured, jam-packed with minerality and on the lower side of the

residual sugar spectrum. Don't miss the Bianco del Casal, an old-vine blend of Garganega and Trebbiano di Soave—it's a dead ringer for top-shelf white Burgundy. I can't recommend these wines highly enough.
